

LABOR'S PLAN TO MAKE BRISBANE A CLIMATE RESILIENT CITY

Tracey Price and Brisbane Labor want to make Brisbane a climate resilient city. People understand that we are living with the effects of climate change every day. Devastating floods, followed by fires, Brisbane is a city that needs to adapt to a changing climate, to protect our unique lifestyle.

Labor's plan will see Brisbane become Australia's lifestyle capital with more trees, less waste and safer communities.

Policy and Background - Climate Resilient City

Climate Resilience:

Labor will make Brisbane a more climate resilient city through increased funding for drainage, flood mitigation and a renewed focus on disaster preparedness. Part of Labor's plan is more sustainable development practices to deal with the ongoing effects of climate change in suburban Brisbane.

- Labor will increase the suburban drainage budget and build more flood mitigation projects across Brisbane's suburbs. This includes reinstating all funding for drainage and flood works cut by the LNP.
 - Increase the suburban drainage budget by \$2.8m a year
 - o Increase funding for new stormwater drainage by \$6.3m a year
 - Increase the maintenance funding on stormwater systems by \$3.5m a year
 - Double the funding for desilting drains to \$1.6m a year
- Clean and maintain more waterways, targeting problem areas.
 - o Double the vegetation management budget to \$1.5m a year.
- Include planning changes to better prepare suburbs for effects of climate change.
 Review City Plan to implement better standards for development in flood prone areas.
- Restrict development in known flood affected areas and increase development where it won't affect flooding to deal with the housing shortage.
- Re-establish the flood buy-back scheme and invest \$5 mil per year to offer voluntary buy-back of flood affected and low-lying homes.
- Better prepare Council and Brisbane to deal with the ongoing effects of climate change like floods and bushfires.

Organic Recycling or FOGO:

Labor will introduce a full and comprehensive Food Organics, Garden Organics (FOGO) waste management system, diverting 100% of organic waste from landfill. This will create sustainable jobs, reduce emissions and reduce pressure on ratepayers.

- The green lid FOGO bins would be collected weekly, increasing vital waste services for Brisbane residents.
- The annual fee for green bins will be scrapped, as this is a free service.
- A city-wide FOGO system would create three times as many jobs as landfill, remove 100,000 tonnes of organic waste from our landfill, saving residents millions in waste levy charges.
- Recycling organic waste would reduce greenhouse gas emissions and reduce Council's carbon footprint. Compost produced could be sold for profit, reducing costs for ratepayers.
- This organic recycling scheme will be funded in partnership with the Queensland Government's GROW FOGO Program.
- This policy will save over \$600m for ratepayers over the next 10 years reducing rates.

Protecting our Natural Assets:

Labor will fight to protect our unique flora and fauna, and work towards 40% cover by 2030.

- Saving vital habitat from demolition and development through Labor's Bushland Guarantee, using 100% of the proceeds from the bushland acquisition levy to purchase new bushland.
- Protecting our wildlife by conducting a city-wide audit of wildlife corridors and crossings, beginning with the construction of koala fencing at White Hills Reserve and other natural areas.
- Rewilding Brisbane's waterways and greenspaces, using scientific best practice.
- Planting 2 million trees across Brisbane's suburbs, making Brisbane safer and more walkable, providing more shade in parks and along footpaths.

Giving Back the Places we Love:

Public spaces across Brisbane are today used as commercial opportunities by the LNP. Labor will change all this.

 Revitalise King George Square as a subtropical space, adding trees, water features, and shade. Save our public spaces like King George Square, Victoria Park and Mt Coot-Tha from the LNP's overcommercialisation and give places back to the people.

Win the War on Waste:

To operate alongside our city-wide FOGO system, Labor will continue to fight the war on waste and work on diverting more waste from landfill, saving the people of Brisbane money.

- Install 1,500 new park recycling bins across Brisbane.
- Continue to investigate soft plastics recycling, working with industry to develop a trial.
- Introduce Containers for Change bins around our city and suburbs, with funds going to local charities.
